“How did you get food?” Joe asked, aghast.


“There were two kind families among the Mercers,” Lucy said. “They gave food to the watchman for us. But then one of those families left town, and the other was locked up like us.”

“And I saw another one with Adam and Eve,” he said. “Do they sell snakes or apples?”


“Apples and other fruit. You’re getting the hang of it.” She smiled encouragingly at him, as though he was a small child.

“It seemed that Tobias didn’t want me here, Madam,” Joe said cautiously.




"Isn't that just coincidence?"





